Quirgan chos de Corazón pronounced Kear Keen cho day Core à zun Quirgunchus muy refer to the name of a town, an armadillo, or a traditional instrument Harry Andean Armadillo, chattophractus nationi locally culled Quirgunches or Mulita. This pointy eared + nosed armadillors one of 20 species m South America. It's shell is scaley, hard + covered with huits. Apparently the meat of this insectivor mamma listasty. Its shall traditionally is used to make the Charongo, a traditional 10-string little quiter, which is 18th century Perniran modefreation of the Spanish lute or mandolin.
