Specknerm - Gromany, England Music is "Nonesuch" a mulody from John Playford's "The English Dancing Master" from 1651. Anna Barbara Speckner, a Munich harpsichardist edited arrangements of old dance melocities for Key board instruments. Her nickname "Specknerin" became the name of a dance created by Lenchen Bush in the 1470s. Busch was head of Munich's Cricle for Historical Dances. German choreography from 1470s for a baroque Enclish dance melody The original English dance is a longuage set of 8. presumably numed for the Palace of Nonesuch - one of Henry Sta's, Cheam, Surray, UK. * Speckner - might mean field, tage, stick. Speckner might be a basket maker.
